Our Role at Narita International Airport Corporation and Narita International Airport's Eco-Airport Objectives

Narita International Airport is a thriving hub of business activities and services performed by over 500 businesses and organizations including the airlines, freight houses, tenants and government agencies.

Narita International Airport Corporation (NAA), as the founder and operator of the airport, develops and improves its facilities, etc., and strives to create a safe, convenient airport for the customers that use it and the people who work there.

NAA works in conjunction with a large number of stakeholders to develop a sustainable airport to produce an airport of value with a viable future as the gateway to the skies of Japan.

An eco-airport master plan encompassing the entire airport has been created for Narita International Airport.

The Eco-Airport Planning and Developing Council incorporating airport businesses and NAA plays a central driving role in environment-friendly, eco-airport initiatives.

Purpose of this Report

- The Environment Report is produced to offer information on the initiatives undertaken independently by NAA and those being implemented in conjunction with the many airport-related businesses.

- It incorporates more diagrams, maps, tables and photographs augmented by interviews and glossaries to make the information more understandable to a wider section of people.

- The Special Feature section reports on environmental initiatives related to the northern extension of Runway B and profiles recent initiatives by NAA and airport-related businesses in four areas within the airport.

- In the descriptions of these environment strategies, the report also includes objective data such as monitoring results and achievement levels.

Reporting Period

Data in the report is from the period April 2008 through March 2009. However, activity information applies mainly to the period until the end of August 2009.

Scope of Report

- The scope of this report takes in the activities of NAA and all of the airport-related businesses, covering environment conservation activities throughout the airport. Data on power, water, waste and greenhouse gases applies to the airport as a whole, including usage and emission by airport-related businesses. Other data applies to NAA.

- "NAA" refers to Narita International Airport Corporation in the report. However, "Narita Airport" refers to the airport as a whole, including the airport-related businesses.



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
