New Narita – Seoul(Incheon) Service to be Launched by Aero K on May 30,

Aero K (IATA code: RF) will launch its first scheduled passenger service between Narita and Seoul (Incheon) on Thursday, May 30, 2024. Seoul (Incheon) will be RF's second city in South Korea served as an international route from Narita in addition to Cheongju, which is RF's base airport. The Seoul route has the highest number of passengers carried at Narita Airport, and RF will be the 13th airline to operate this route.

Seoul in South Korea is a popular overseas travel destination, and the Lotte World Tower, which opened in 2017, is the tallest landmark in South Korea at 555 meters and 123 stories. The Dalpimjigae (Moonlight Rainbow) Fountain is a fountain show that falls from both sides of the bridge into the Hangang River, creating a beautiful rainbow-colored nightscape with water streams and colorful lights synchronized to the music played. In recent years, Seoul has also become popular for its K-pop music, films and TV dramas, as well as Korean beauty, cosmetics, and fashion.

Promoting with their catch line "The Beginning of a New Journey," RF's new service is expected to further expand the options available to customers. We hope you will take advantage of Narita Airport's ever-expanding international routes.

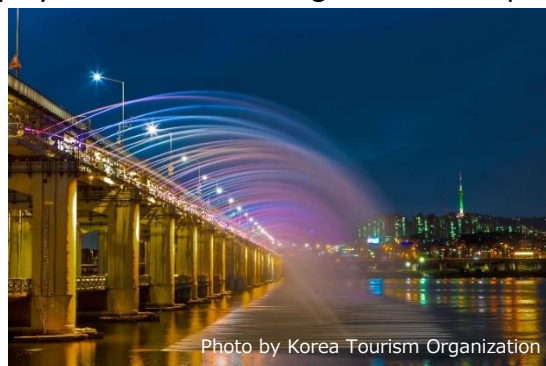
