



Narita International Airport and Dallas Fort Worth International Airport Sign Airport Alliance Memorandum of Understanding

- Strengthening Ties and Improving Information Exchange -

Tokyo, 9 September 2015: Narita International Airport Corporation (NAA) and Dallas Fort Worth International Airport Board (DFW) have signed a Memorandum of Understanding to strengthen cooperative ties between the two major hub airports in air transport.

The MoU formalizes strong cooperative ties between the two airports, with the specific objective of further expanding the airports' global aviation network and providing high quality services to the customers. Signing of the MoU comes as a result of the long and friendly relations enjoyed by the both parties.

Based on this agreement, NAA and DFW will share ideas and best practices of airport operation and management on a regular basis. By sharing the expertise and techniques accumulated by the two airports from their long experience in airport management, it is hoped that a greater level of operational efficiency will be achieved at both locations.

Japan Airlines recently announced the return of their NRT-DFW service and traffic on the route is expected to continue growing.

The stronger cooperative ties will serve as the foundation for sharing knowledge and setting out initiatives that focus on promoting use of the two airports. The now formal relationship will further enhance Narita's network advantage as the lynchpin between Asia and North America and produce greater convenience for the travelers using the two airports.
