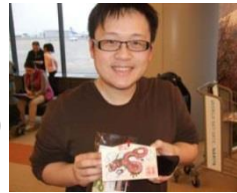
Lion Dance Parade

Traditional Performing Art Shows

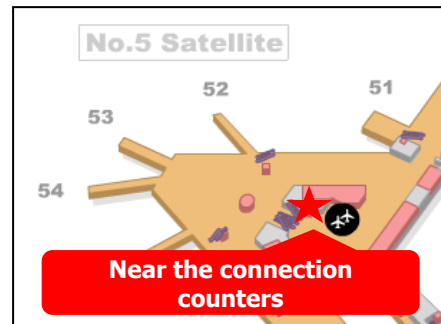
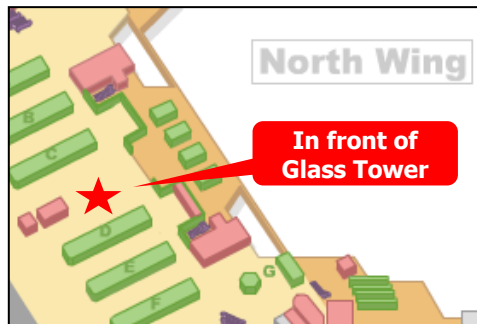
