### The Seven Lucky Gods Musical Performer Parade

The Seven Lucky Gods believed to bring people happiness and prosperity will make an appearance at Narita Airport for the first time, as a troupe of musical performers. They will parade through the terminals performing "doyou", traditional Japanese nursery rhymes widely beloved in Japan and "nagauta", ancient 16<sup>th</sup> century songs performed with shamisen (Japanese musical instrument with three strings) and drums. Departing passengers will have the opportunity for a souvenir photograph taken with the Seven Lucky Gods.
